From the Director

THE S.P.A.'S PET FOOD MONEY BANK FUNDRAISER STARTS NOW! The S.P.A., San Miguel's only no-kill shelter for dogs and cats, houses a combined average of 100 animals and often has more in foster homes. Last year, almost 100 cats and dogs were adopted from us. As our cats and dogs become a part of families, we take in more animals. We provide shelter, care, and food for all of them until they become family companions—no matter how long it takes.

Many factors impact our food cost. Some animals are so malnourished when they arrive that we must give them special supplemental food until they become stronger. We have a number of animals who, due to age and a variety of health conditions, require food designed to meet their unique needs.

Our goal is to raise \$250,000 pesos (about \$13,500 USD), 100% of which will be applied to our annual cost of feeding our animals. Look at some of our <u>Hungry Dogs</u> and <u>Hungry Cats</u>! Please help us feed them by making a monetary deposit to our Pet Food Money Bank. We rely solely on financial donations to survive and receive no government support.



Kairo's Cancer Scare: A Lesson About the Sun's Potential Effects on Pets By Jayn Corral

They were screams, not cries, that caused the staff to run to see what was happening. There on the roof was a cat screaming. One of the men approached it and gently put it in a bag to take to the clinic for examination. The cat was a long-haired, white cat, almost double in size due to all the burrs and thistles.

He did not put up any resistance during his exam or when the vet shaved him to get rid of the debris in his fur. Fortunately, he didn't appear to have any internal injuries, but his ears and nose were another story. They were crusted with scabs, dried blood and raw and the tips of his ears curled down.

The vet said there is a cancer that starts in the ears and nose. Squamous cell carcinoma is generally caused by long-term exposure to sunlight and white cats are most susceptible. As cancers go, squamous is painful and invasive. A biopsy of both the nose and ears would be necessary. It would be 7 to 10 days before the biopsy results would be known. What a cruel twist of fate that this beautiful creature found his way to us and then may not survive his cancer.

Each day Kairo greeted his visitors by snuggling on their lap, kneading their arms to soak up all the love he could. We feared his days were numbered and we wanted to give him all the time and love we could for the few days he had with us.

It was a Sunday morning, when the S.P.A. is closed, that the vet called with the news. Unbelievably, the biopsies were negative! We don't know how many of his 9 lives he had used up, but everyone celebrated the news, relieved to know that this loving, brave boy had at least one more chance at life.

Kairo's fur is growing back and his ears and nose are healing. The wonderful news is that he has already been adopted! An important lesson from this experience is to be aware of the damage that can be done by the sun. Make sure your animals have shade as well as food, water and love.

Unfortunately, within a few days after Kairo was adopted, he escaped from his new home, but we are hopeful he will turn up. Please keep your eyes open for him and let us know if you have any information about his whereabouts. Thank you!
