HOPE, HEALTH, HOMES FOR CATS AND DOGS IN NEED

From the Director

For those of you who have recently adopted a cat or dog, do you know about the “Rule of Three”? This is a rule that you might find useful in understanding your new pet’s adjustment to her change in circumstances. Oftentimes, we might not appreciate the difficulty of the transition and perhaps become impatient while waiting for a new pet to settle into her new routine.

The Rule of Three gives you a guideline for gauging the time it might take for your cat or dog to fully acclimate to her home. During the first three days, your new best friend might be very stressed, overwhelmed by all the changes. During this time, she might be frightened, wary, shy, hide, not have any appetite, and may have diarrhea. It generally takes about three weeks for her to get used to the people, the house, and the new routine. During this period, it is a good idea to set boundaries and establish rules. After about three months, your new pet will finally start feeling comfortable and secure in her home with you. She will have built a bond of love and trust with you and your family.

These are only guidelines—some pets take longer, some shorter. The animal’s background impacts how this all plays out as well. No matter what, it is important to be patient, kind, and understanding. Empathize with what your new cat or dog is experiencing. Educate yourself on how to help with each period of adjustment. In the end, you will reap the benefits by thoroughly enjoying your new pet.

On that note, we encourage you to adopt from the S.P.A.! We have some terrific dogs and cats, just waiting to meet you and become a part of your family.

The S.P.A. Saves Dogs from Canine Control—A Long History

For many years, the S.P.A. has taken in dogs from San Miguel's kill shelter. When it was across the street from the S.P.A. and referred to as "Ecologia," we would walk over and see what dogs we could save and be sad about the ones we couldn't. In 2012, Gypsy was one of the dogs we rescued. In 2021, when her owner became ill and could no longer take care of her, Gypsy returned to the S.P.A., now named Cleo.

When we have space, our first choice is to go to Canine Control to choose dogs to bring in. The lives of these dogs are in danger. A number of factors play a role in our decision. First is knowing what space we have available. We can't bring in a large dog if we only have room for smaller dogs. We can't bring in 5 dogs if we only have space for 2. The temperament, age, and health of the dogs are critical. We always go to Canine Control with our veterinarian, Dr. Omar Córdova, so he can conduct a basic physical on the dogs and also test them for parvo and distemper. We see how the dogs react to us and to other dogs at Canine Control. We do our best to bring in healthy, adoptable dogs. Even then, the dogs we choose are kept in isolation at the S.P.A. for at least a week.

Too often, the dogs at Canine Control are not in the best of health. Adopters are not given veterinary advice about the health of the dog being considered for adoption. To assist those who have chosen to adopt a dog from Canine Control, the S.P.A. has initiated a free consultation program. That's right – free! A coupon will be given to an interested adopter for a free consultation with the S.P.A.'s veterinarian as long as the consultation is done within 30 days of adoption. We encourage adopters to contact the S.P.A. from Canine Control to arrange to bring the dog in to see our vet as soon as possible. This is especially important if the adopter has other pets at home. Our hope is to give new owners valuable information and peace of mind.

Right now, we have 13 dogs we brought in from Canine Control: Nina, Charlie, Annie, Clara, Sammy, Champ, Sierra, and Angel plus five new dogs: Valentina, Buddy, Sunshine, Sasha, and Bailey. Each dog we rescued was scheduled to be euthanized by Canine Control. We're so happy to have saved them. Each is ready for adoption and to become part of a loving family.

He welcomes new arrivals and helps them settle in. He takes equal interest in the volunteers, always the first to come say hello and get his purr on with the first pat. He loves touch and affection and is a 100% friend at heart.

Every morning a dedicated S.P.A. staff member drops in to change blankets as needed, empty the litter boxes, ensure the water and dry food bowls are full, and thoroughly clean the space.

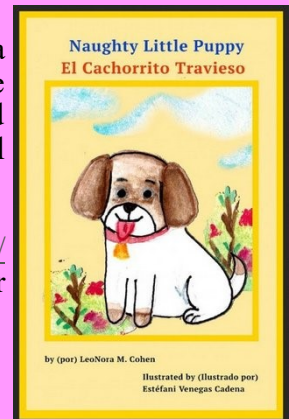

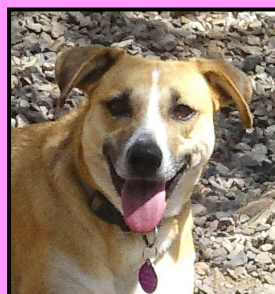

We have a well-equipped clinic and offer packages to help you save on vaccinations and sterilization. Under the current circumstances, we prefer that no one enters the clinic other than S.P.A. personnel. If critical, only 1 person may enter the S.P.A. with his animal and that person must wear a mask and stay 6 feet (2 meters) away from S.P.A. personnel. Thank you for your consideration in following these rules.
