
August Pets of the Month By Megan Gabel and Heidi Wulfers

The Canadian Adventure

As I'm sure some of you have noticed, dog adoptions haven't been particularly soaring at the S.P.A. We hoped that sending some dogs to a foster-based shelter in Canada would open a world of opportunity for our dogs. The fact that the dogs would be in homes and not cages while they waited to be adopted is an important ingredient for us.

A lot goes into preparing to send dogs to Canada for adoption. Deciding on which dogs would be good candidates is the first step. Size matters. Personality and adoptability are important considerations. Making sure all of their vaccinations and tests comply with U.S., Canadian, and transport requirements is critical. Each dog needs a collar with a tag with the dog's name. They need to start getting used to being in a crate. A care bag of food, water, paper towels, and poop bags should be assembled. The dogs need to be checked by the vet and we hope to give each dog a bath before the trip. All paperwork has to be completed and signed by the vet on a timely basis.

We chose four dogs to go on the latest trip to Canada scheduled for July 5 departure: Charlie, Sunshine, Dexter, and Blondie. At the last minute, we added Annie who already had an adopter lined up in Canada. The dogs would be put on a transport here to meet and be put on a transport scheduled to leave for Canada from San Antonio, Texas at 6 p.m. on July 5.

On July 4, we moved the crates out of the dogs' cages to near the S.P.A. exit door where the dogs would be loaded on the van in the middle of the night. We removed food and water by 4 p.m. that day. At 3 a.m. on July 5, flashlights in hand, Cotton, Harry, and I met Julio and David to load the five dogs in the van. Each dog was wearing a harness and had a leash handy to use on short walks during the long trip. The departure went very smoothly. By around 3:15 a.m., we waved goodbye.

I checked in with Julio a few hours later and learned that three of the five dogs threw up in the van (car sick) and pooped inside the van as well. Not a surprise. When I checked in later to see how close they were to San Antonio, I learned that they were stuck at the border to the U.S. There was a traffic jam because one of the bridges had been closed. I contacted the Canadian transport to see if they would wait for us if we ran a little late. They said they couldn't. The pressure mounted to get into the U.S. I kept in contact with Julio and the Canadian transport, hoping we could make it to San Antonio in time. The van with our dogs was in line for over 2 hours! When they finally reached the inspectors, Julio and David were asked to take all the dogs out of their crates while the inside of the van was inspected. With six inspectors standing over her, sweet little Annie got scared, backed out of her harness, and ran! Fortunately, David caught her and brought her back to safety.

It was after 5 p.m. when they made it through to the U.S., but there was no way they were going to meet the 6 p.m. San Antonio deadline. Luckily, they were able to get to the next loading point, Katy, Texas. Late, but the Canadian transporter agreed to wait. The dogs arrived in Canada on Friday, July 7. Charlie, Blondie, and Sunshine discovered the joys of stretching out on a couch and Dexter curled up in a cushy bed. Sunshine has a new BFF, a puppy in her foster home – the perfect choice to keep up with Sunshine's energy. Annie is surrounded by love from her new family. They think she is the perfect dog! A lover of water, she has already dipped in the lake for a swim. Look at the smile on her face!



So, if you adopt a kitten, they may not turn out to be the companion you imagined. However, once the kitten's personality is well established, you know what you are getting. Hence, I knew Remy was the right choice for my household situation.

I was talking with another volunteer in the adult area of the cattery. Three of our cats, Robin, Ritz, and Aussie, were climbing on my lap and head butting my arm. They are older cats who, once upon a time, were particularly difficult challenges for one reason or another. But now that they have matured, learned to trust, and have fully formed personalities, I would easily recommend them to the right adopter.
