



Why I Love Older Pets By Heidi Wulfers

As one of seven children growing up in a college town in Northeastern Ohio, I came to know and love many kinds of animals. My parents encouraged each of us to take in pets for our own, not only for the pleasure they brought, but as a way to teach responsibility. Thus we had a menagerie: dogs, cats, fish, canaries, ducks, hamsters, white mice, and a horse! My mother drew the line at boa constrictors!

I moved away from Ohio in 1974, and away from pet ownership, when I went off to university, and then to a life overseas. Animals just didn't fit the world I was in.

Fast forward to 2019. My boys are grown and in exciting faraway places. Our furry family have gone, one by one, to the rainbow bridge. So what now? Now I volunteer at the S.P.A. here in San Miguel. And what wonderful loving special animals are here.

It seems many who come to the S.P.A. wanting to adopt desire the young ones. Understandably. They are so sweet, and so cute! But I must say, there are some amazing, AMAZING, dogs and cats of a more mature age whom one can adopt. Xel-Ha and Trinidad are two cats that come to mind.

I asked them what plans they had made for their pets should something happen to them. The woman asked, in surprise, "You mean if I die?" And I said, "Yes." She said that they hadn't thought about that.


How many times have you read a post about a dog or cat who has become homeless because of the death of the owner? Luckily, people in the community seem to rally around to try to help and find a new home for the formerly beloved pet, but that's not so easy to do.

My husband and I have made arrangements for someone to look after our dog if something happens to us. That person has a key to our house and contact information for someone in the States who also has a key to our house and will come to San Miguel to get our dog. Their information is posted on a bulletin board in our house. We have provided each with details about our dog – who our vet is – what food she eats and when – where the food is in our house and other matters that are important to our dog's daily routine. We are members of the 24 Hour Association and have included in our paperwork the fact that we have a dog and who to contact if something happens to us.

What have you done? No matter what your age, if you own pets, isn't it time you considered their future? How about setting up a tag team to take care of your animals should something happen to you, permanently or temporarily? Make it even easier by providing detailed instructions about your pet's needs.

Also, please consider adopting an older dog or cat, one that you have a better chance of outliving than a puppy or kitten. At the S.P.A., Nube, now almost 8 years old, is a beautiful, medium-large, spry and playful dog. She's affectionate, but not demanding, and loves to go for a walk. Miny, a little over 6 years old, is large, playful, curious, friendly, very sweet, and just adorable. She needs coaxing to go for a walk and would be happy in a home where she could be by your side and give you all the attention you want.
