



Lost, Found, and Abandoned Pets

The number of lost, found, and abandoned animals in San Miguel continues to increase. Rescuers are overwhelmed with animals they are temporarily trying to help with food, care, and shelter while working on finding them homes. There are many they cannot help because they lack the space to keep them. The problem is exacerbated by the fact that adoptions are slow all over. We can all chip in to help dogs and cats lead safer, more secure lives in San Miguel de Allende. Here's how.

Important information:

- 1. Emergency help: 911.
- 2. Canine Control Center: 415-154-7200 located behind the Presidencia. A map is <u>HERE</u>.
- 3. Radio San Miguel: 415-152-0227 or 415-152-0799, Sollano #4.
- 4. Civil List San Miguel: https://groups.io/g/CivilSMA1
- 5. Pet SOS San Miguel de Allende Facebook: https://www.facebook.com/groups/745106518845566
- 6. The S.P.A.: Los Pinos 7, 415-152-6124.
- 7. Preventative steps: an identification tag greatly enhances the likelihood of reuniting pets with their owners.

If You Lose Your Pet:

- 1. Visit the Canine Control Center at least every other day. It is the city's kill shelter. An animal picked up by the Canine Control Center may have only a few days to live, so act promptly. Many wonderful dogs are there on death row. Yours could be one of them. In recent months, the S.P.A. has rescued Annie, Sunshine, Charlie, Bailey, and more from Canine Control. They possibly had owners who never came for them.
- 2. Contact Radio San Miguel. Describe your pet in detail and offer a reward.
- 3. Post photos and a bilingual description on a poster in the area where your pet was last seen, offering a reward for a safe return.
- 4. Post details and photos on the Civil List, and Pet SOS.

Whenever someone reports a lost dog, we urge the person to visit Canine Control immediately and often. In April 2022, the S.P.A. took in a dog from Canine Control who was adopted from the S.P.A. a few months later. Recently, the original owner of the dog spotted this dog who was out with a dog walker. He immediately recognized the dog as his! The dog and her owner were reunited.

In response to our request, he came into the S.P.A. with the dog so we could verify that all was okay. We learned that the dog had been lost in January 2022 and probably picked up by Canine Control in April 2022, a few days before we rescued her. The owner reported the lost dog to us in January 2022. At our suggestion, the owner had gone to Canine Control in January and February, but didn't find his dog. He stopped checking Canine Control then.

Lesson learned: keep checking Canine Control for your lost dog!









Lost, Found, and Abandoned Pets (continued)

If You Find a Pet:

- 1. Approach any stray animal with caution, offering food and water. If the animal seems too frightened and aggressive, get help from a skilled professional or the Canine Control Center. For cats too timid or frightened to approach humans, consider borrowing one of the S.P.A.'s humane cat traps.
- 2. If the animal is not aggressive, take the animal to a vet as soon as possible. Our S.P.A. vet (and others) will examine the stray, determine health status, and start vaccinations and any other necessary treatment.
- 3. Post details and photos on the Civil List and Pet SOS.
- 4. Listen to Radio San Miguel to see if anyone has advertised about losing a pet of that description.
- 5. If no luck finding the owner, put the dog or cat on the appropriate S.P.A. waiting list. However, be aware that you are responsible for the animal you found and that the wait for space at the S.P.A. may be long. Try to find a home for the animal by posting details on various Facebook page such as SMA Pet Rescue, Adopción y Rescate de Mascotas (https://www.facebook.com/groups/637247790773535/). Screen adopters carefully. Sterilize the animal before adoption. Please do not release the animal to fend for itself.

Please note that the S.P.A. is not equipped to help rescue a stray dog or cat, find a lost pet, or get involved with a situation involving animal abuse (call 911 to report). We wish we had the personnel and finances to help all needy animals!

R.I.P. Susie


Our Susie had been at the S.P.A. since April 30, 2011. She was 2-1/2 years old when she showed up by herself on that day, pregnant and ready to give birth which she did that evening – nine puppies. She changed a lot over the years, from a dog that non-S.P.A. workers feared to a loving, affectionate, happy dog that no one feared. She became smaller with a very white face. Susie loved getting attention and affection and was more than willing to reciprocate with kisses. She was a very smart dog, alert and attentive. She loved going for a walk. She liked to snuggle in her crate with a soft blanket or stretch out on top of her crate so she could peruse all the activities at the S.P.A. Her playgroup was always the younger, smaller dogs, the ones that most reminded her of her own puppies from long ago. Not too long ago, she rushed to be with them: https://youtu.be/jxTcJOLpQzU

We watched Susie age gracefully and begin to struggle with a few minor health issues. In all these years, no one ever asked about adopting her. But she didn't suffer for being overlooked – we, at the S.P.A., loved and cherished her and were always there for her.

Susie was found dead in her casita the morning of April 10, 2023. We miss her.

The Sociedad Protectora de Animales de San Miguel de Allende, A.C., San Miguel's oldest no-kill shelter for dogs and cats, houses a combined average of 100 animals. We provide food, care (vaccinations, sterilization, veterinary and medical care), and shelter for all of them until they become family companions—no matter how long it takes.

The S.P.A.'s annual Pet Food Money Bank fundraiser is our only major fundraiser of the year. The purpose of the fundraiser is to raise money to cover the annual cost to feed our resident animals like Dexter, Sara, Miny, and Martin. The goal of this year's Pet Food Money Bank is \$250,000 pesos (about \$14,000 USD). All funds raised—100%—will be applied to the annual cost of food for our family-pets-to-be.



animals. Some are so malnourished when they arrive that we must give

them special supplemental food until they become stronger. Many of our animals, dogs in particular, have been at the S.P.A. for a long time (years). As they age, they require food designed to address the needs of older animals. Even some of our younger animals are sometimes on a unique diet. For these reasons, we have had to switch some of our residents from our regular, economy-priced food to other options. Because animals do not adjust well to changes in diet and we lack sufficient storage space, we need to raise money to cover the annual cost of feeding our cats and dogs, rather than seek donations of food.

Almost 5 years old, Tigre is a large dog who is sweet and gentle despite his



We're walking up a hill, the sun is to our left, our shadows to the right. I mention my memory hiatus and how Freud uses talking as a cure when dealing with cognitive issues. Susie stops. Gives me a "what gives" look. I explain. As soon as I finish, she blinks, and I say, "Cate Blanchett." Cool. We continue our climb.

I love my time with Susie and the S.P.A. dogs. In addition to being with such wonderful creatures who are so into you and appreciative, I find when walking with them I'm open to all kinds of ideas—there's a free flowing exchange that weaves its way into my mind set, tributaries are explored. Good thoughts accumulate. I'm stimulated. I decide to test Susie. I want to mention an English playwright to Mike, but again, I'm lapsing. Geez. I sit on a rock and rub Susie's ears, neck, and back. Her eyes tunnel into me. "Okay, he's English. First studied acting. Wrote poetry. Became famous in the 1950s as a playwright." I must say I have confidence in Susie. Learn About Us and Our Cats and Dogs

*The S.P.A. is open for adoptions as long as certain precautions are followed. If you come to the S.P.A. with family or friends, only one person will be allowed to enter the S.P.A. to be interviewed for an adoption of a cat or dog. That person must wear a mask and stay at least 6 feet (2 meters) away from S.P.A. personnel. Adoption hours are Monday-Saturday, 11-2.
