

Lost and Found Pets

By Megan Gabel

We can all chip in to help dogs and cats lead safer, more secure lives in San Miguel de Allende. Here's how.

Important information:

- 1. Emergency help: 911.
- 2. Canine Control Center: 415-154-7200 located behind the Presidencia.
- 3. Radio San Miguel: 415-152-0227 or 415-152-0799, Sollano #4.
- 4. Civil List San Miguel: HERE
- 5. Pet SOS San Miguel de Allende Facebook: HERE
- 6. The S.P.A.: Los Pinos 7, 415-152-6124.
- 7. Preventative steps: an identification tag greatly enhances the likelihood of reuniting a pet with its owner.

If You Lose Your Pet:

- 1. Visit the Canine Control Center at least every other day. An animal picked up by the Canine Control Center may have only a few days to live, so act promptly. The S.P.A. was lucky to have rescued Luke and Star from the Canine Control Center.
- 2. Contact Radio San Miguel. Describe your pet in detail and offer a reward.
- 3. Post photos and a bilingual description in the area where your pet was last seen, offering a reward for a safe return.
- 4. Post details and photos on the various IO Groups geared to San Miguel de Allende, in particular, the Civil List, and on Pet SOS.
- 5. Bring a photo with details to the S.P.A. to post.

If You Find A Pet:

- 1. Approach any stray animal with caution, offering food and water. If the animal seems too frightened and aggressive, get help from a skilled professional or the Canine Control Center. For cats too timid or frightened to approach humans, consider borrowing one of the S.P.A.'s humane cat traps.
- 2. If the animal is not aggressive, take the animal to a vet as soon as possible. Our S.P.A .vet (and others) will examine the stray, determine health status, and start vaccinations and any other necessary treatment.
- 3. Post details and photos on the Civil List and Pet SOS.
- 4. Bring a photo with details to the S.P.A. to post.
- 5. Listen to Radio San Miguel to see if anyone has advertised about losing a pet of that description.
- 6. If you cannot keep the animal permanently, put the dog or cat on the appropriate S.P.A. waiting list. However, be aware that you are responsible for the animal you found and that the wait for space at the S.P.A. may be long.
- 7. If you cannot give the animal a temporary home, please find a foster or boarding situation. Please call the S.P.A. for suggestions.

Report instances of animal abuse by calling 911. The dispatcher will take the report and forward it to

Canine Control Center personnel, who then will go out right away to check the situation. Don't give up. Be persistent. English-speaking dispatchers are available because of our large expat community. These reports can also be anonymous.

Please note that the S.P.A. is not equipped to help rescue a stray dog or cat, find a lost pet, or get involved with a situation involving animal abuse. We wish we had the personnel and finances to help all needy animals!



doesn't do anything halfway. He's all in—a good reminder for me to be whenever I engage a project. Another good life example I glean from Paco is his appreciation for the now. He doesn't fret about the past or waste time worrying about the future or consider what if scenarios. After all, there's no point. The present is what matters to him and he devours it.

Legendary trumpeter Louis Armstrong in a 1932 command performance for the king of England said, "This one's for you, Rex." As I write this in 2021, I think, "This is for you, Paco."

If you are thinking about adopting, please consider Paco and other S.P.A. animals (cats or dogs) as a possible new family member. Our available cats and dogs are on our website https://www.spasanmiguel.org/ - the "Adopt Me" pages. For both, our adoption fee is only 600 pesos and includes all current vaccinations, deworming, and sterilization. Our adoption hours at the S.P.A., Los Pinos #7, are Monday-Saturday between 11 and 2. Only one person may enter the S.P.A. for an adoption interview. That person must wear a mask and stay at least 6 feet away from S.P.A. personnel.

Feline Aggression

Running an animal shelter can be a tricky and very complicated endeavor. Add to that the communal living aspect for cats such as what the S.P.A. has. We have group living arrangements – our cats are not caged. We create separate spaces for cats of different ages and temperaments. Just like people, cats have a variety of personalities, needs, and preferences. Put them all together and you never know what will happen.

Having arrived at only three months old and spending more than two years at the S.P.A., Nadia has seen many cats come and go. She loves people and is a wonderful cat in all ways except one. Nadia will accept and become friends with some new cats and terrorize others. We cannot figure out why.





Then there is Ritz, a sweet one-year old. She is friendly with cats and volunteers, yet the sight of our veterinarian makes her go crazy, really insane! We try our best to make the experience tolerable for her. Nothing seems to help yet, but we're working on it. In the meantime, Dr. Omar Córdova is not taking it personally.

Feline aggression is hostile or violent behavior intended to dominate or intimidate. There are several types of feline aggression, including play, fear, petting-induced, redirected, pain-induced, status induced, territorial, maternal, inter-cat, and idiopathic. An aggressive cat will show signs such as dilated pupils, flat ears or whiskers, and erect puffed twitching tail. Aggression develops gradually, usually between 8 to 24 months of age, beginning with hissing and growling, escalating to swatting and chasing, then attacking and fighting. Catfights are seldom fatal, but the wound has an 80% chance of becoming infected, which, if left untreated, can lead to death.

When cats are surrendered to shelters because of problems with their behavior, the behavior at issue is usually aggression. A cat can victimize another cat, people, or in the case of re-directed aggression, anyone within striking distance. If not stopped, aggressive behavior can become a learned and accepted behavior. So, it is very important to recognize and manage it.

Managing aggressive behavior begins with a proper introduction to the new situation, people, or other pets. Typically, the newcomer is the victim so he should be given his own safe haven, separate from other cats for a few days or even longer, if necessary. Using treats, a shared toy, and exchanging bedding are ways to gradually get the cats to accept each other. It is never appropriate to scold or punish the aggressive cat. A squirt bottle with water will let the cat know the behavior is not acceptable. If you have an aggressive cat or end up adopting one, the situation is challenging, but not hopeless.




The S.P.A.'s clinic is open! The S.P.A. can meet your pet's needs, from routine preventative care to diagnosis and treatment of problems to surgical procedures and more. We have a well-equipped clinic and offer packages to help you save on vaccinations and sterilization. Under the current circumstances, we prefer that no one enters the clinic other than S.P.A. personnel. If critical, only 1 person may enter the S.P.A. with his animal and that person must wear a mask and stay 6 feet (2 meters) away from S.P.A. personnel. Thank you for your consideration in following these rules.





If you come to the S.P.A. with family or friends, only one person will be allowed to enter the S.P.A. to be interviewed for an adoption of a cat or dog. That person must wear a mask and stay at least 6 feet (2 meters) away from S.P.A. personnel. Adoption hours are Monday-Saturday, 11-2.
