
The Sociedad Protectora de Animales de San Miguel de Allende, A. C. is the oldest no-kill shelter for cats and dogs in San Miguel de Allende. We have been providing food, shelter, and care for unwanted and abandoned animals since 1980. Our goal has always been to find permanent, loving homes for our cats and dogs. We have an on-site clinic that provides veterinary services for our own animals and those belonging to the public. This year, we have continued to focus on taking in dogs from the Canine Control Center (the government kill shelter), saving them from certain death. Grace, Charlie, and Annie are among those we rescued from that facility in 2022. Grace is a sweet, gentle hound dog who loves affection. Charley is a hugger, friendly to people and other dogs. Annie is a lover, eager to go for a walk. She welcomes attention. Each is a wonderful dog and would do very well as a member of any family.





Maggie and Sofia, Subtle Sweethearts By Megan Gabel

Maggie and Sofia are among the smaller dogs at the S.P.A. They are both shy when meeting new people, although Maggie warms up faster than Sofia. It takes a little more effort to gain Sofia's trust. Both about 2-1/2 years old, they are leery of cars and motorcycles and approach their walks outside the S.P.A. with caution. It really sets their minds at ease if walked with another dog. Neither is demanding of attention or time. Both have the capacity to be affectionate and loyal. We've seen that transformation as our volunteers relate to them. Reluctance becomes willingness.

Maggie rolls on her back, feet in the air, when you try to put a harness on her for a walk. She gives little kisses at the same time. Limp as a noddle, she can be slid across the floor, rolled back over, her little body twisted so you can reach the snap for the harness.

Sofia often hides in the back of her casita as you wait to put a harness on her. She ventures out slowly, crouches flat on the floor, and lets you prepare her for a walk. No resistance anymore.

So, what kind of home would be best for them? They would need families willing to give them a period of adjustment, not only to the adopters, but to being in a new home. Sofia might hide. Maggie might bark. They both might resist going for a walk. All of that can be overcome with time and patience.

They probably would do best with another dog in the house. Adopting them together would work just great!

Enrich Your Life by Adopting a Senior Dog By Megan Gabel


Please consider opening your heart to a senior pet. A win-win situation! The dog benefits and you benefit. What more could you ask?

Adopting older dogs has many advantages. Older dogs are calmer than youngsters and need less exercise. Their personalities are developed and they're fully grown so there are few surprises. They are eager to learn new tricks and are less demanding of attention. They are particularly appropriate choices for an older person to adopt who would love to experience the joy of pet ownership, but probably doesn't have the energy level for a younger animal. Older adopted pets seem to understand what you have done for them by taking them into your family and they return your kindness with uncommon love and devotion.

Senior animals are also good for your health and well-being! Companion animals can help lower blood pressure and reduce stress. They provide unconditional love and friendship which, in turn, reduce depression and the feeling of isolation and loneliness. Take your dog for daily walks and meet your neighbors. Social interactions and activities increase when you're holding a dog's leash.


There is no standard definition of "senior," but the consensus is that a dog older than 7 (depending upon size) falls within this category. Among the senior S.P.A. dogs are Dulce (11), Rita (11), Tessie (9), Apollo (7), Miny (9), Shy (13-1/2), Susie (13-1/2), Sonny (9), and Lola (9). Choco By David Stone



I am an avid reader of the S.P.A.'s monthly newsletter, Paws & Claws. I have particularly enjoyed the articles about the cats. Reading them has inspired me to write about my cat and what a joy she was in my life.

When we lived in Delavan, Wisconsin in the 90s, my wife and son saw a small black Burmese kitten, apparently abandoned on the main avenue of the downtown area. She looked up at them with beckoning green eyes. They brought her home and named her for her color, which in bright light, had a deep chocolate sheen.

As she grew, Choco raced around the big Victorian house, flying like a bat with her pointed ears, running so fast that she ran on the walls of the upstairs hallway. At the time, I had an upstairs library with a large Persian carpet. One time, Choco raced into the library when I opened the door to go in. She loved to roll on the thick carpet, explore the books on the lower shelves and the artifacts on the upper shelves. She jumped up onto the upper shelves, walked daintily among the small items without touching or disturbing the position of anything.

She was a "princess" who swatted the other pets: Amber, a big, friendly Calico cat and Lydia, a large, friendly wolf-looking dog. Unlike Amber, Choco resisted being put in a cat carrier to visit the vet or to move. On the big move to Maryland, Amber slept quietly in her carrier while Choco complained. After the move to the house in Baltimore, when everything was still in boxes, Choco was nowhere to be seen and I worried that somehow she got lost or was injured in the move. But when everything calmed down, she emerged from hiding.

In smaller quarters with fewer rooms and no separate library room, fewer bookshelves and no big carpet, I slept on a couch in the same room as my desk and fewer bookshelves and allowed Choco to sleep on the couch. I became active in mail art, including stamp art. I used a Choco stamp in my mail art. Choco walked on my table where I kept art supplies, flipped open the lid of an ink stamp pad, put her paw on the pad, then on a piece of paper which was next to the pad and left her paw print. She lived to the age of 21 and was buried in the yard of the house.



The items below are supplies we replace on a regular basis. Please drop off donations at the S.P.A. during our regular office hours.

If critical, only 1 person may enter the S.P.A. with his animal and that person must wear a mask and stay 6 feet (2 meters) away from S.P.A. personnel.
